Johdveer: "my favourite song was called Beatlemania. It was really interesting."

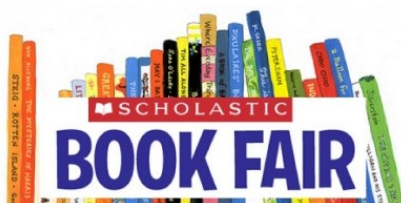
Kemiyah: "it was good. I liked singing. There were lots of children and it was nice to sing together."

Inhalers in School



If your child has been diagnosed with Asthma, then they should have an inhaler in school at all times. The inhaler must be handed into the school office with the completed Asthma Form (available on the school website or from the school office). When we have your child's inhaler in school, please be aware of the following: -

- You will need to take a note of the expiry date of your child's medication. It is the parent/ carers responsibility in ensuring the medication is in date.
- Regularly check your child's inhaler is not getting low on medication.
- It is the parent/carers responsibility to ensure that your child's spacer and plastic inhaler unit is cleaned regularly.
- The inhaler will be kept with their teacher in the classroom and will be easily accessible.
- Please ensure the school office is updated of any changes to your child's dosage.
