As British Citizens we are SO lucky because our country is democratic and we are allowed to vote (when you are 18) on who represents our communities. In fact the UK even fought a war (against the Nazis) to ensure we could be democratic and all have a say.

The lucky bit is that if you do not like the rules of a particular leader (for example David Cameron), you could vote to stop that leader being in charge. If enough people agreed with you, then that leader would not be in charge any more. In some undemocratic countries leaders can make unpopular and often cruel rules and there is nothing you can do.

Unfortunately over 40,000 people in our city will not be allowed to vote because they didn't register in time. They therefore won't have had their voices heard in Thursday's elections. Some people think this is really sad because you should be making an effort to shape the country.
